
Housing & Poverty – Interwoven Issues

- •5 year plan (2018-2023)
- Released in July 2018
- •55 actions under 5 goals



HOUSING FRAMEWORK




Actions by Other Jurisdictions

- Build housing expertise and capacity
- Complete housing needs assessment
- Develop and implement an Affordable housing policy
- Implement incentives for housing development including:
 - Zoning, by-laws, density, land use
 - Property tax forgiveness
 - Grants
 - Land
 - Require affordable units in any new development
 - Other support services (water / sewer)
 - Reduce administration for developers
 - Other

Poverty Reduction Action Plan

- •5 year plan (2019-2024)
- Released in November 2018
- •67 actions under 4 goals



Goals of the Poverty Reduction Action Plan

- 1. To help Islanders in need
- 2. To support the most vulnerable
- 3. To build on our supportive communities and partners
- To improve the well-being of children and youth

Actions by other Jurisdictions

- Vibrant Communities Canada
 - Resource Library
 - Community of Practice
- Living Saint John
 - 100 partners coordinating efforts to address health, education, and employment
- Hamilton Rountable
 - Advocacy and education involving people with lived experience
